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## **CONTRACT TOWER FUNDING LEVELS PROPOSED FOR FISCAL YEAR 2008**

House and Senate negotiators on the fiscal year 2008 DOT spending bill have agreed to fully fund both the regular and cost-share contract tower programs.

However, because the Senate failed to pass the conference agreement, final decisions on key DOT and FAA funding items for next year likely will be settled as part of an omnibus spending agreement to be negotiated between Congress and the President in December. While the path forward to enactment of the DOT spending bill is unknown at the moment, it is unlikely that the specific aviation-related provisions and funding levels in the conference agreement — including the contract tower program — will undergo major changes. The only question remaining is the timing of the passage of the legislation.

The following language on the contract tower program is included in the conference report:

“Contract tower program — The conference agreement includes \$8.5 million to continue the contract tower cost-sharing program as proposed by both the House and Senate. In addition, consistent with the House proposal, the conferees provide \$103 million for the contract tower base program, and allow FAA to use unsubscribed funds from the contract tower base line program to avoid elimination of communities from the cost-share towers program. The conferees allow this flexibility only after all base line tower obligations are fulfilled. The Senate proposed \$99.4 million for the base program.”

## **THOMAS R. JONES NAMED AS CONTRACT TOWER MANAGER**

Thomas R. Jones was named the new manager of FAA’s Contract Tower Program, replacing Harold Thomas who

retired earlier this year.

Jones has more than 20 years of combined Department of Defense and FAA acquisition management experience. During his time at FAA, Jones has promoted the air traffic organization model and focused on service delivery and customers’ requirements.

Within the past five years at FAA, Jones has served as project lead for the ASR-11 Surveillance Radar System. In this capacity, he managed the process for radar siting, facility design, environmental mitigations monitoring, real estate acquisition, radar facility construction, radar facility and system acceptance, and radar implementation into the National Airspace System for Initial Operating Capability and Operational Readiness Demonstration of the radar.

Among his many honors, Jones has received FAA’s Performance Award. He holds a Master’s degree in Engineering Administration from Virginia Tech and a Bachelor’s degree in Industrial Engineering from North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University.

## **FAA REAUTHORIZATION BILL STALLED IN CONGRESS**

The fate of FAA reauthorization legislation now pending in Congress is unclear. The House passed H.R.2881, the FAA Reauthorization Act of 2007, on Sept. 20. The four-

year bill would raise the PFC cap from \$4.50 to \$7 and authorize \$15.8 billion for AIP.

The Senate's version of the reauthorization bill has been stalled, however. The Senate Commerce Committee approved S.1300, the Aviation Investment and Modernization Act of 2007, in May. However, the Senate has not considered its version of FAA reauthorization due largely to a debate over how to pay for air traffic control modernization.

The last FAA reauthorization bill and the aviation excise taxes were set to expire at the end of September. However, Congress has approved the continuation of aviation taxes and AIP funding through Dec. 14.

The FAA reauthorization bill passed by the full House in September contains several AAAE/USCTA-backed contract tower provisions, including:

- Increases the authorization for the contract tower cost-sharing program to \$8.5 million in fiscal year 2008 with \$500,000 annual increases in subsequent fiscal years;
- Provides FAA the flexibility to use fully funded contract tower program funds if needed for funding cost-share towers (only after all qualified fully funded towers have been funded) and visa versa (only after all qualified cost-share towers have been funded);
- Increases the maximum federal participation in a contract tower construction project from \$1.5 million to \$2 million;
- Provides new contract tower cost-share airports a grace period of 18 months before the first cost-share payments are required; and
- Requires uniform standards and requirements for safety assessments of FAA contract towers.

The Senate's FAA reauthorization bill contains these same provisions.

## **FAA ADDS FOUR TOWERS TO CONTRACT TOWER PROGRAM**

Four additional towers have been added to FAA's Contract Tower Program since August 2007, with one of them entering the cost-sharing program.

The three new towers in the fully funded program are Easton, Md.; Georgetown, Texas; and Castle, Calif. Fort Worth-Spinks, Texas, entered the cost-sharing program.

The contract tower program now has 239 towers, with 32 of them in the cost-sharing program.

## **FAA EXPANDS AIR TRAFFIC EDUCATION PROGRAM**

FAA reported that the number of prospective air traffic controllers is expected to increase significantly now that

nine new colleges and universities have been selected by the agency to train students to be controllers.

There are now 23 schools chosen by FAA to participate in the agency's Air Traffic Collegiate Training Initiative (CTI) program. The CTI program is part of a broader effort by the agency to recruit, train and hire controllers as the current workforce faces retirement. CTI schools are accredited and offer a non-engineering aviation degree in aviation programs.

"We have a plan in place to make sure the nation's airspace system is managed by an appropriate number of highly motivated, properly trained controllers," said Hank Krakowski, chief operating officer of FAA's Air Traffic Organization. "The CTI program is a big part of that plan."

Of the 1,815 new controllers hired in fiscal year 2007 — a number exceeding the target set in the agency's controller workforce plan — approximately 800 were graduates of CTI schools, FAA said. Graduation does not guarantee acceptance to the FAA Academy in Oklahoma City, but those accepted are allowed to skip the initial, five-week basic training in air traffic control, the agency added.

Nine additional schools were chosen after being evaluated in three areas: organizational foundation and resources, organization credibility and curriculum and facilities. They are: Arizona State University; Community College of Baltimore County (Md.); Florida Community College-Jacksonville (Fla.); Green River Community

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College (Wash.); Lewis University (Ill.); Kent State University (Ohio); the Metropolitan State College of Denver (Colo.); Middle Georgia College; and the University of Oklahoma.

The nine schools join 14 others that renewed their commitment to the program, which was first established in 1990 at Minneapolis Community and Technical College. Schools already offering CTI programs are: Community College of Beaver County (Pa.); Daniel Webster College (N.H.); Dowling College (N.Y.); Embry-Riddle-Daytona Beach (Fla.); Hampton University (Va.); Inter-American University of Puerto Rico; Miami Dade County College (Fla.); Middle Tennessee State University; Minneapolis Community and Technical College (Minn.); Mount San Antonio (Calif.); Purdue University (Ind.); University of Alaska; University of North Dakota; and Vaughn College of Aeronautics (New York).

FAA evaluates all CTI programs on a regular basis. The next evaluation will take place in January, the agency said.

### **MIDWEST ATC AWARDED CONTRACT BY AIR FORCE FOR FIVE BASES**

Midwest ATC Service announced that it has been awarded a contract to provide transient aircraft maintenance/ground handling services at five U.S. air bases in

Southwest Asia.

The contract will be performed primarily in the Headquarters United States Central Air Force Area of Responsibility. The contract was awarded to the team of Midwest ATC Service and Readiness Management Support (RMS) by the U. S. Air Force Contract Augmentation Program (AFCAP) to meet the mission requirements of the Defense Department. Midwest ATC and RMS have partnered on numerous AFCAP Air Traffic Management and airfield services contracts, both domestically and overseas, over the past several years.

This contract award expands the role that Midwest ATC has played in developing Afghanistan's air traffic control system to support Operation Enduring Freedom. The company has been providing Air Traffic Management Services at multiple bases in Southwest Asia since 2003.

"Midwest ATC is excited and gratified that we will have the opportunity to continue providing urgently needed aviation services in support of U.S. military operations globally," said company President Shane Cordes.

### **KISSIMMEE (FLA.) HONORS ATC CHIEF SHANNON THOMAS**

Kissimmee (Fla.) Mayor Jim Swan on Aug. 28 presented the Key to the City to Shannon Thomas, chief of the Kissimmee Gateway Airport Air Traffic Control Tower, for his outstanding leadership in conducting safe and efficient operations at the airport. Kissimmee is an FAA contract tower operated by RVA.
